13/53 Apologies:

Apologies were presented and accepted from Councillors Mrs. J. Manley, Mrs. T. Howells and Shropshire Councillor S. Jones.

13/54 Co-option of new Member:

The Chairman welcomed Mr. P. Sharp to the meeting who had applied to be co-opted onto the Council to fill one of the advertised vacant seats. After due consideration, Mr. Sharp was co-opted and invited to remain for the meeting.

13/55 Declaration of Personal or Prejudicial Interests:

There were no declarations of interests.

13/56 Minutes of Meeting held on June 11th. 2013:

The minutes of the meeting, having been circulated, were approved and signed by the Chairman as a true record.

13/57 Matters Arising:

(a) Highways (13/45 & 13/38(f):

It was noted that the remaining 20mph signs had been put in place and that the Highways Department were looking into the possibility of a footpath from the bus stop into White Lodge Park.

(b) White Gates (13/38 (b)):

Clerk had raised this again the with the enforcement officer but had still not received a response about any possible action.

(c) Simon's Garage (13/38(c)):

A reply from Shropshire Council's Public Protection Officer stated that he had visited the site and noted that domestic grease was being used and the rails were on private property. There was no health and safety risk and as such the Department was unable to take action.

(d) Burial Ground (13/38(d)):

- (i)Clerk reported that the only suggested change to the revised regulations was to include the dimensions of the plaques for cremation plaques. These had been included and the new document would now be distributed.
- (ii)Mrs Medley suggested that Members should re-visit the decision about the layout of the area for burying cremated ashes and include an area for placing flowers etc. After consideration this was agreed and Mrs. Medley offered to discuss this with Mr. Bailey and ask him to do the necessary work (e) Mrs. S. Johnson (13/45(a)):

Clerk had spoken to Mrs. Manley, who had suggested inviting Mrs. Johnson to the meeting and she had agreed to the postponement of the visit until the September meeting. An interesting and informative letter from Sally had been circulated to all Members

(f) Car Park:

Mr. Bailey had suggested that a second bin would ease the problem of litter on the Council car park. This had been discussed with Shropshire Council's Street Scene Team and they had suggested that they should empty the current bin more frequently to see if that solved the problem.
