First World War Graves:

Having identified six uncared for service personnel graves in the grave yard of St. Mary the Virgin Church, in what is the RAF Centenary Year and 100 years since the end of World War 1, Councillors Jill Manley and Sam McIntosh decided action was needed.

So on a wet and blustery September Saturday, with the permission and backing of the Reverend Rich Cresswell and the support of fellow Councillors and volunteers, enthusiastic and respectful work was carried out to clean and tidy all the graves.

This is not the end of the project as Sam and Jill are continuing to look into the history behind the WW1 burials and more information will eventually be published on the Council's web site.
